

Documenting Your Research Using APA Style (6th ed.)

A Book with One Author

Basic format:

Author, A. A. (Publication year). *Title of the book*. Place of publication: Publisher.

Example:

Beck, C. A. (2001). *Family mediation: Facts, myths, and future prospects*. Washington, DC: American Psychological Association.

A Book with Two or More Authors

Basic format:

Author, A. A., Author, B. B. & Author, C. C. (Publication year). *Title of the book*. Place of publication: Publisher.

Example:

Retschneider, J. G., & McCoy, N. L. (1968). *Social Learning*. Englewood Cliffs, NJ: Prentice Hall.

An Article in a Reference Book

Basic format:

Author, A. A. (Publication year). Title of article. In *Title of Reference Book*. (Volume, pages).
Place of Publication: Publisher.

Example:

Bergmann, P. G. (1993). Relativity. In *The new encyclopedia Britannica* (Vol. 26, pp. 501-508). Chicago: Encyclopedia Britannica.

A Scholarly Journal Article

Basic format:

Author's name. (Publication year). Title of Article. *Journal Title*, *Volume number* (Issue)*, Page numbers.

***If the issue number isn't available, you may leave it out.**

Example:

Mellers, B. A. (2000). Choice and the relative pleasure of consequences. *Psychological Bulletin*, 126(1), 910-924.

APA STYLE

A Magazine Article

Basic format:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Year, Month). Title of Article. *Magazine Title*, *Volume number*(Issue), Page numbers.

Example:

Kandel, E. R., & Squire, L. R. (2000, November). Neuroscience: Breaking down scientific barriers to the study of the brain and mind. *Science*, *290*(3), 1113-1120.

An Online Journal Article with DOI

Basic format:

Author, A. A. (Publication year). Title of Article. *Journal Title*, *Volume number*(Issue), Page numbers.
doi:xx.xxxxxxxxxx.

Example:

Brownlie, D. Toward effective poster presentations: An annotated bibliography. *European Journal of Marketing*, *41*(11/12), 1245-1283. doi:10.1108/03090560710821161.

An Online Journal Article without DOI (when DOI is not available)

Basic format:

Author, A. A. (Publication year). Title of Article. *Journal Title*, *Volume number*(Issue), Page numbers.
Retrieved from URL of journal

Example:

Borman, W. C., Hanson, M. A., Oppler, S. H., Pulakos, E. D., & White, L. A. (1993). Role of early supervisory experience in supervisor performance. *Journal of Applied Psychology*, *78*, 443-449.
Retrieved from <http://www.apa.org/pubs/journals/apl/index.aspx>

A Web Site or Page

Basic format:

Author, A. A. (Last edited date). *Title of resource*. Retrieved from URL

Example:

Angeli, E., Wagner, J., Lawrick, E., Moore, K., Anderson, M., Soderland, L., & Brizee, A. (2010 May 5).
General format. Retrieved from <http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/560/01/>
